



**ORDINANCE 2012-11 RATIFYING ALL ORDINANCES, RESOLUTIONS AND PROPOSITIONS WHICH REQUIRE(D) THE EXPENDITURE OF MONEY AND WHICH WERE APPROVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL BEGINNING SEPTEMBER 3, 2009 AND ENDING SEPTEMBER 27, 2012**

**WHEREAS**, the Town of Perdido Beach was incorporated on June 10, 2009; and

**WHEREAS**, the first meeting of the Town Council was held on September 3, 2009 at which time the Council adopted ORDINANCE 2009-01 ADOPTING COUNCIL MEETING ORDER OF PROCEDURE; and


**WHEREAS**, Section 22 of Ordinance 2009-01 states, "All Ordinances, resolutions or propositions submitted to the council which require the expenditure of money shall lie over until the next meeting; provided, that such ordinance, resolution or proposition may be considered earlier by unanimous consent of the council; and provided further, that this rule shall not apply to the current expenses of, or contracts previously made with regular salaries of officers or wages of employees of the city."; and

**WHEREAS**, at the September 27, 2012 Council Meeting, Councilman Rhoe "Al" Thompson brought to the attention of the Council that the Council had adopted RESOLUTION 2012-28 AWARDING CONTRACT FOR DISASTER DEBRIS MONITORING TO THOMPSON CONSULTING SERVICES at its first hearing; and

**WHEREAS**, after investigation into past council minutes, it was discovered that similar actions by the Council had taken place on various occasions.

**THEREFORE**, the Town Council, recognizing that the Council has acted in good faith with no intent to bypass the rule set forth in Section 22 of Ordinance 2009-01, does hereby ratify all ordinances, resolutions and propositions which require(d) the expenditure of money and which were approved by the Town Council beginning September 3, 2009 and ending September 27, 2012.
