Article XIX Amendments to Official Zoning Map and Ordinance Section 19.1 Purpose

The Official Zoning Map for the Town of Perdido Beach may be amended from time to time in accordance with the procedures and standards set forth in this Article. The purpose of this Article is not to relieve particular hardships, not to confer special privileges or rights on any person, but rather to allow for adjustments to the Official Zoning Map that are necessary in light of changed conditions or changes in public policy or that are necessary to advance the general welfare of the Town. Land Use and Zoning text amendments may be necessary to further the Town's land use policies and to keep pace with current development trends but are not necessary to the amendment of the Official Zoning Map.

Section 19.2 Initiation Map Amendment.

An amendment to the Official Zoning Map may be initiated:

- (a) by written application of any person owning the property proposed for change on the Official Zoning Map, or by written authorization by the owner for an agent to act on the owner's behalf,
- (b) by a motion of the Planning Commission, or
- (c) by a motion of the Town Council.

Councilman Love made a motion that the Town Council of the Town of Perdido Beach in accordance with section 19.2 of the Land Use and Zoning Ordinance authorize the initiation of the rezoning process for parcel number 63-04-18-0-001-001.000 described as lots 1-4 of Soldiers Creek Addition Block 14. The purpose is to rezone from R-1 to OR to allow for a public pier and public boat launch. The motion was seconded by Councilman Kiefer.

RESOLUTION 2017-27APPOINTING AD HOC COMMITTEE TO ENDORSE EFFORTS OF THE ALABAMA BICENTENNIAL COMMISSION

WHEREAS, the United States Congress created the Alabama Territory from the eastern half of the Mississippi Territory on March 3, 1817; and,

WHEREAS, by 1819, the birth and growth of cities, towns, and communities in the Alabama Territory ensured that the population of the Territory had developed sufficiently to achieve the minimum number of inhabitants required by Congress to qualify for Statehood; and,

WHEREAS, the United States Congress and President James Monroe approved Statehood for the Alabama Territory on December 14, 1819 making it the nation's twenty-second state; and,

WHEREAS, the Alabama Legislature approved a resolution in 2013 establishing the Alabama Bicentennial Commission to mark the 200th anniversary of Statehood; and,

WHEREAS, constitutional officers and other officials appointed Commission members to organize and execute a bicentennial celebration intended to improve the education and understanding of all Alabamians and visitors regarding the State's history and heritage; and to create and promote lasting initiatives designed to benefit the State and its citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the bicentennial period of reflection and commemoration, 2017 to 2019, has been divided into three thematic years to acknowledge distinctly: the environment, both natural and constructed, including especially the cities, towns, and communities which compose the State; the people, regardless of race, culture, or background; and the history, both ancient and recent, of the State of Alabama; and,

WHEREAS, commemorations and celebrations will enable and encourage Alabamians of all ages and backgrounds, together with visitors, to experience Alabama's rich cultural, historic, and natural resources, thereby stimulating the economy of Alabama through local economic growth; and,

WHEREAS, full participation and contributory efforts by the localities of the State, through their various councils, committees, and congregations, are paramount to the success of this historic endeavor; and,

WHEREAS, participation in Alabama's bicentennial is a unique opportunity to celebrate and uplift the State during this historic time;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it hereby proclaimed by the Town Council of the Town of Perdido Beach, that by this action, they endorse the efforts of the Alabama Bicentennial Commission and hereby resolve to aid the Alabama Bicentennial Commission in promoting, planning, and executing the Commission's historic, educational, celebratory, and cultural initiatives by forming or supporting a Community Celebration Committee to observe and commemorate the bicentennial of the State of Alabama.





RESOLUTION 2017-08 APPROVING FUNDS TO PERFORM NON-BID WORK FOR THE TOWN OF PERDIDO BEACH

WHEREAS, Section 11-43-56, Code of Alabama 1975, states: Management and control of finances and property of municipality. Except as otherwise provided, the council shall have the management and control of the finances and all the property, real and personal, belonging to the city or town; and

WHEREAS, Section 11-47-5, Code of Alabama 1975, states: Execution of contracts. Contracts entered into by a municipality shall be in writing, signed and executed in the name of the city or town by the officers authorized to make the same and by the party contracting. In cases not otherwise directed by law or ordinance, such contracts shall be entered into and executed by the mayor in the name of the city or town and all obligations for the payment of money by the municipality, except for bonds and interest coupons, shall be attested by the clerk. This section shall not be construed to cover purchases for the ordinary needs of the municipality.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Council does hereby approve funds to be paid from the British Petroleum (BP) funds to perform non-bid work for the Town, specifically, forestry mowing on lots 1 through 4 located on Tuscaloosa Drive, for the purpose of constructing a boat ramp and pier, and does hereby award contract to Mako Forestry in the amount of \$2,000.00 for the completion of said work. Any contracts associated with this approval shall be in writing, signed and executed by the Mayor in the name of the Town of Perdido Beach and all obligations for payment of compensation shall be attested by the clerk.
