RESOLUTION 2019-07 AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH LUCIDO ENGINEERING AND SURVEYING, LLC TO COMPILE AN ARCHITURAIL DESIGN PLAN TO CONSTRUCT A BOAT LAUCH AND PIER AT STATE STREET FOR THE TOWN OF PERDIDO BEACH

WHEREAS, Section 11-43-56, Code of Alabama 1975; Management and control of finances and property of municipality. Except as otherwise provided, the council shall have the management and control of the finances and all the property, real and personal, belonging to the city or town; and

WHEREAS, Section 11-47-5, Code of Alabama 1975; Execution of contracts. Contracts entered into by a municipality shall be in writing, signed and executed in the name of the city or town by the officers authorized to make the same and by the party contracting. In cases not otherwise directed by law or ordinance, such contracts shall be entered into and executed by the mayor in the name of the city or town and all obligations for the payment of money by the municipality, except for bonds and interest coupons, shall be attested by the clerk. This section shall not be construed to cover purchases for the ordinary needs of the municipality.

WHEREAS, the Town of Perdido Beach is intending to construct a public boat ramp, finger pier, access road, and parking lot on a tract of land owned by the town, which is located between Tuscaloosa Dr. and Soldier Creek and within the State St. right of way.

WHEREAS, it will be necessary to obtain a design plan and architectural drawings from an engineering firm licensed in the State of Alabama, in order to provide a scope of work and obtain bids from licensed contractors, Lucido Engineering, LLC and Surveying has agreed to assist the town with this project by providing the following services:

Prepare a topographic base map and tree location (trees larger than 6" diameter at 4.5" high) of the site; prepare the final design of the gravel access road, a gated concrete boat ramp, an ADA access pier, sidewalk and parking. Upon approval of the final design, construction drawings and specifications will be prepared for bidding to contractors. For the construction phase services; evaluate contractors bids and qualifying documentation, make recommendations to accept the qualified bidder, set control points (once) for the contractors use, evaluate contractors pay request and recommend payment amount.

The estimated fee for these services is no more than \$18,600.00. Any additional charges will be approved by the Town Council. PROPOSAL ATTACHED

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Council does hereby authorize Mayor Hamilton to enter into a contract with Lucido Engineering and Surveying, LLC C/O: Vince Lucido to compile a design plan, architectural drawings and a scope of work to construct the proposed public boat launch facility, on the property located between Tuscaloosa

Drive and Soldier Creek and is along the south side of the State Street right of way. County Parcel #63-04-18-0-001-001.000 (PPIN 011210)

Any contracts associated with this approval shall be in writing, signed and executed by the Mayor in the name of the Town of Perdido Beach and all obligations for payment of compensation shall be attested by the clerk.

Income and expenses seem to be in line with the Budget for the month of August with expenses being \$1181.94 greater than income which is in line with budget projections for this month. Sales taxes, lodging tax, and Simplesell tax all exceeded budget for the month of August. Income for the year is ahead of Budget by \$13,295.37 and expenses are under Budget by \$48152.18 for the year.
- Work is complete on the budget for 2020 and it is presented with this
 report tonight for your review with a vote coming in October. Each
 Committee should take their Budget figure and list by priority their
 recommendations to the Mayor about how The Town should spend the
 funds.
- The General Fund had \$268,789.11 in it as of 08/31/2019. This number is like your checking account and varies daily. We have to always remain mindful of Budget constraints when considering new projects.
- You will notice a new income line item on the Budget for Gas and Diesel. This will represent the Town's portion of the new Gas Tax implemented September 1, by the State of Alabama. The funds received from the Rebuild Alabama Act may only be expended for the following
- 1. The maintenance, improvement, replacement, and construction of roads and bridges
- 2. Matching funds for federal road or bridge projects;
- 3. Debt repayment for road and bridge projects; or
- 4. Joint road and bridge projects with one or more municipalities and/or counties;
- The special BP account has \$118,777.43 left in it which represents the money remaining to be spent on the State Street Park. The special BP checking account has \$22,781.14 remaining in it as of 08/31/19. See attached sheet for Capital improvement and Gas tax account balances.
- Our finances appear to be good at this time. Again income is above projected Budget and expenses are below Budget projections currently.

Budget and Finance Meeting Report Town Council Meeting October 10, 2019

- The Committee met October 8, 2019 and is continuing to review the various financial reports to ensure expenditures are in line with the budget and the bank accounts for accuracy. Income and expenses seem to be in line with the Budget for the month of September with income being \$46,803.94 greater than expenses due to receiving the Franchise fee check from Riviera for the year, which is in line with budget projections for this month. Sales taxes, lodging tax, and Simplesell tax all exceeded budget for the month of September. Income for the fiscal year was ahead of Budget by \$14,242.60 and expenses are under Budget by \$50,753.73 for the year. This left the Town with a net income of \$71,181.33 for the year (unaudited).
- Work is complete on the budget for 2020 and it is presented with this
 report again tonight for your review and approve tonight. Each Committee
 should take their Budget figure and list by priority their recommendations to
 the Mayor about how The Town should spend the funds.
- The General Fund had \$316,760.77 in it as of 09/31/2019. This number is like your checking account and varies daily. We have to always remain mindful of Budget constraints when considering new projects.
- The special BP account has \$118,875.38 left in it which represents the money remaining to be spent on the State Street Park. The special BP checking account has \$21,907.88 remaining in it as of 09/31/19. See attached sheet for Capital improvement and Gas tax account balances.
- Our finances for the year appear to be strong. Again income is above projected Budget and expenses are below Budget projections.
