The Planning Commission of the Town of Perdido Beach held its last Working Meeting on Wednesday, February 10, 2010 at 6:30 PM in the Town Hall of Perdido Beach, Alabama.

The Planning Commission discussed additional business to include:

Motion by Commissioner Batson, second by Commissioner Graham to approve Article V-Commercial Districts with the following change:

Commercial Districts B-1 and B-2, deleted "small" and "retail" in the heading of 5.1 and in 5.1.1 and also inserted "businesses" in 5.1.1 Section 5.1 B-1, reads Professional and Local Business District. Mr. Moore's notes attached.

All in favor motion passed unanimously.

Meeting adjourned at approximately 9:17 PM.

After discussion of lot sizes and density all agreed that a "Waterfront District" previously proposed by Commissioner Batson would be better served as a Waterfront overlay on the proposed zoning map and the "R-4 District", previously proposed by Commissioner Coate would be designated "R-3", on the proposed zoning map.
