**AMENDING RESOLUTION 2009-05 NAMING OFFICIAL  
NEWSPAPER**

**WHEREAS**, the Town of Perdido Beach, Alabama, is in need of an official newspaper in which to advertise public notices of certain proposed actions by the Town Council; and

**WHEREAS**, there is no newspaper published in the Town of Perdido Beach, Alabama; and

**WHEREAS**, the Foley Onlooker is located in Baldwin County and has a general circulation in the Town of Perdido Beach.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Council of the Town of Perdido Beach, Alabama, that the Foley Onlooker is hereby named the official newspaper of the Town of Perdido Beach, Alabama, to be used for the publication of proposed actions which require public notification in a newspaper.

**(Council notes - not part of the resolution)**

**\*The amendment would allow the Town and the Planning Commission to advertise only in four places in the Town without violating town policy - a practice allowed under the law - Code of Alabama Section 11-52-77. According to Tracy Roberts with the League, the only time a municipality in which no newspaper is published must advertise in a newspaper is in the case of a "wet/dry" referendum. It was his suggestion to add the words "in a newspaper" to amend the original resolution.**
